New Billing Guide Available for the Justice Involved Reentry Initiative

The Division of Health Care Financing & Policy (DHCFP) is excited to announce the release of the new Justice Involved Reentry Initiative billing guide. The billing guide can be found on the [Billing Information](#) page.

This new Initiative expands Nevada Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) services to ensure care for eligible juveniles during their critical transition period before and after release from institutional or carceral settings.

Effective January 1, 2025, Nevada Medicaid and CHIP will include the following services 30-day pre- and post-release:

- Physical (diagnostic) and brief emotional/behavioral assessment
- Certain Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) services for eligible juveniles.
- Targeted Case Management (TCM) services to ensure continuity of care and support

Eligible Provider Types

The following provider types are authorized to deliver and bill for these services under the new guidelines:

- PT 14 – Behavioral Health Outpatient Treatment
- PT 20 – Physician, M.D., Osteopath, D.O.
- PT 22 – Dentist
- PT 24 – Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN)
- PT 26 – Psychologist
- PT 54 – Targeted Case Management (TCM)
- PT 77 – Physician's Assistant (PA/PA-C)
- PT 82 – Behavioral Health Rehabilitative Treatment

Participating providers performing EPSDT screening services must follow guidelines per the scope of their license and the Medicaid Services Manual (MSM).
