Attention Provider Types 12 and 45:

Instructions for New Federal Emergency Services (FES) Program Certification Forms Required for Emergency Dialysis Services for Certain Non-U.S. Citizens

Effective September 1, 2013, emergency medical coverage is available for emergency dialysis services for certain non-United States citizens, who otherwise meet the requirements for Nevada Medicaid eligibility, to stabilize kidney failure and further emergency care necessary for the treatment of such kidney failure under the treating physician's certified treatment plan. Nevada Medicaid End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) providers must complete and sign Emergency Dialysis Case Certification forms to certify that a non-U S citizen has met the medical conditions to be eligible to receive outpatient emergency ESRD services through the Federal Emergency Services (FES) program.

- The Initial Emergency Dialysis Case Certification (form FA-100) must be completed and attached to the initial claim for outpatient emergency dialysis services for all new FES recipients covered under the FES program.
- The Monthly Emergency Dialysis Case Certification (form FA-101) must be completed and signed at the beginning of each month and placed in the FES recipient's file.
